

Woman dies after she's stabbed, pushed from car

Police seeking motive, better description of vehicle

Police continue to search for the person who fatally stabbed a Rochester woman and dumped her from a car on Dewey Avenue early yesterday.

Marne Brundige, 37, of 176 Parkway, was found in front of 62 Dewey Ave. shortly after midnight last night.

"We believe she was pushed out from a vehicle," said Capt. Michael Karnes, who heads the police department's Central Investigations Division.

"She was discovered by a passerby who thought she was struck by a car."

Police were summoned and

Brundige, who was still conscious at the time, said she had been stabbed.

She was taken to Rochester General Hospital where she was pronounced dead at 2:17 a.m.

The Monroe County medical examiner's office ruled her death a homicide as a result of multiple stab wounds.

While police have determined how she died, they said they don't know yet why she was killed, Karnes said.

Police also don't have a good description of the vehicle that dropped her off, he said.

Brundige was last seen about 11 p.m. Monday night near Saratoga

and Lorimer streets.

"Violence is always upsetting but it's happening everywhere and you can't run away from it," said Jacelyn Springer, who lives on Lorimer St.

Springer said many of her neighbors are active in community programs such as neighborhood watches against crime.

"You just join together and try to prevent it," she said. □
